Publication Notice

Purpose. This booklet is an educational field guide for lawful citizen participation, grassroots lobbying and public-policy engagement. It does not grant civil authority, replace legal counsel or authorize any person to disregard law, security procedures, meeting rules or ethical standards.

Current information. Officeholders, vacancies, committee assignments, telephone numbers, maps and organizational information change. Directory content is marked current as of July 20, 2026. Verify every time-sensitive detail through the official source before travel, testimony, publication, fundraising or a public call to action.

Neutral directory notice. Inclusion of an organization is informational and is not an endorsement, certification of doctrine, legal status, political position or financial stewardship. Organizations may operate through different entities, including charities, social-welfare organizations, political committees and businesses. Confirm the correct entity before donating, partnering or using its materials.

Church and nonprofit compliance. Section 501(c)(3) organizations may address public policy and conduct nonpartisan voter education, but federal tax law prohibits direct or indirect participation or intervention in campaigns for or against candidates. Lobbying by a 501(c)(3) organization must remain within applicable limits. Seek qualified legal and tax advice for your organization's facts.

Scripture. Scripture references are from the King James Version unless otherwise indicated. The biblical language in this guide calls believers to truth, courage, prayer, service and lawful stewardship. It does not confuse the kingdom of God with a political party or human government.

Prepared as a reference booklet. Reproduction of original text for classroom or ministry use should preserve this notice and the source acknowledgments. Official maps remain the work of their issuing government agencies.

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This field guide is arranged for quick use in a church civic class, grassroots workshop, legislative visit, policy briefing or personal study.

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Fast rule: Pray first. Read the bill. Know the district. Make one clear request. Tell the truth. Follow up.

PART I

Biblical responsibility and grassroots action

Authority With Accountability

The believer’s authority begins under God, not above law. Scripture calls the people of God to pray, speak truth, defend the vulnerable, seek wise counsel and live honorably before governing authorities. Grassroots lobbying is one practical way to exercise citizenship without surrendering conscience or confusing political access with spiritual power.

Principle	What it requires
Prayer before pressure	Ask God for wisdom, clean motives and disciplined speech before contacting an official.
Truth before talking points	Never repeat a claim you have not checked. Read the bill text, amendments, fiscal notes and official vote record.
Service before status	Public officials and staff remember constituents who bring usable facts, local stories and workable solutions.
Courage without contempt	Strong disagreement does not require insults, threats or public humiliation.
Persistence without harassment	Follow up respectfully, track the process and build long-term relationships.
Kingdom character in public	Your manner can strengthen or weaken the credibility of your message.

The goal is not merely to be heard. The goal is to bear faithful witness, help produce sound policy and leave the room with your integrity intact.

How to Make a Difference

Use this eleven-step field plan. It is simple enough for a first-time advocate and disciplined enough for an experienced team.

1. Pray and define the burden	State the problem in one sentence. Separate conviction from rumor and emotion from evidence.
2. Identify the decision-maker	Find the correct federal, state, county, city, school-board or agency official. Confirm that you are in the official's district.
3. Research the measure	Read the introduced text, substitute, amendments, fiscal note, committee report and current status.
4. Write one clear ask	Ask the official to support, oppose, amend, coauthor, schedule, investigate or publicly clarify one specific action.
5. Build a district team	Recruit constituents, subject-matter experts, pastors, parents, business owners and affected citizens.
6. Contact the staff	Call first. Ask for the staff member handling the issue and request the preferred method for sending information.
7. Meet and testify	Be early, concise and respectful. Register correctly. Bring written testimony and copies for staff.
8. Follow the calendar	Track hearings, deadlines, calendars, floor votes, conference committees and executive action.
9. Follow up in writing	Thank the official and staff. Restate the ask, answer questions and send promised documentation.
10. Report accurately	Tell supporters what happened without exaggeration. Distinguish a public commitment from a final recorded vote.
11. Stay engaged	One contact rarely changes policy. Build credibility across sessions and election cycles.

The Two-Minute Advocacy Brief

Element	What to say
Who you are	Name, city, district connection and the group you represent, if any.
Why you are there	The bill number or specific policy decision.
What is happening	One verified fact and one local consequence.
What you are asking	One direct action stated in plain language.
Why it matters	A brief human story, constitutional concern, fiscal effect or practical consequence.
What you can provide	Written analysis, constituent contacts, testimony, data or follow-up.
Close	Ask when a decision may be made and who should receive additional information.

Never do this: threaten, trespass, disrupt a proceeding, misrepresent your identity, invent a quotation, offer a personal benefit, publish private staff information or claim that an official “promised” something the official did not actually say.

Basic Steps in the Texas Legislative Process





Governor signs, allows bill to become law without signature, or vetoes



Bill takes effect on the date provided by law

A measure can fail at almost any stage. Deadlines, points of order, calendar placement, amendments and conference decisions matter. Use Texas Legislature Online for the official history and current text.

How a Bill Goes Through the U.S. Congress

Idea is developed and legislative language is drafted



A member introduces the bill in the House or Senate



Bill is numbered and referred to one or more committees



Subcommittee review, hearings and mark-up may occur



Full committee votes whether to report the bill



House Rules process or Senate scheduling determines floor consideration



Originating chamber debates, amends and votes



Other chamber repeats committee and floor process



Both chambers must pass identical text



Differences are resolved by amendments or a conference committee



Final text is enrolled and presented to the President



President signs, vetoes, or takes no action within constitutional time limits



Congress may override a veto by two-thirds vote in each chamber

Not every measure follows the same route. Budget reconciliation, privileged resolutions, suspension of the rules, unanimous consent and special procedures may alter the path.

Common Terms to Know

These definitions are practical summaries. Chamber rules, statutes and official glossaries control when precision matters.

Term	Meaning
Act	A bill that has completed the required legislative and executive steps and has become law.
Adjourn	To end a meeting or legislative day.
Amendment	A formal proposal to change the text of a measure.
Appropriation	Authority for government to spend money for a stated purpose.
Author	The member who files a Texas bill or resolution.
Bicameral	A legislature with two chambers, a House and a Senate.
Bill	A legislative proposal that may create, amend or repeal law.
Calendar	The official list or schedule of measures eligible for consideration.
Chair	The member who presides over a committee.
Committee hearing	A public meeting at which a committee receives testimony and considers measures.
Companion bill	A similar or identical measure filed in the opposite chamber.
Conference committee	A temporary group appointed to resolve differences between House and Senate versions.
Consent calendar	A calendar for measures considered noncontroversial under special procedures.
Constituent	A person who lives in the area represented by an elected official.
Coauthor or cosponsor	A member formally joining support for a measure under chamber rules.
Engrossed	The version of a bill passed by its originating chamber.
Enrolled	The final version passed in identical form by both chambers.
Fiscal note	An estimate of a measure's financial effect on government.
Floor	The chamber while it is formally meeting to conduct business.
Hearing notice	The official announcement of the time, place and agenda for a committee meeting.
Interim	The period between regular legislative sessions.
Joint resolution	A measure commonly used for proposed constitutional amendments or other matters requiring special form.
Journal	The official record of chamber proceedings.

Markup	A committee meeting to debate, amend and vote on a measure.
Motion	A formal proposal that the body take a procedural action.

Attachments: Send only useful material. Name files clearly. Do not bury the request beneath a large packet.

Close: Provide your full name, city, ZIP code, telephone number and the best time for a response.

Subject: District Constituent Request Regarding SB 456

At an In Person Meeting

Stage	Best practice
Before	Confirm the appointment, location, security process, length and staff contact. Assign one spokesperson and one note-taker.
Opening	Thank the official or staff member. Introduce the group and establish the district connection.
Ask	State the bill number and requested action within the first minute.
Evidence	Use two or three strong points, not ten weak points. Distinguish facts, forecasts and personal experience.
Listen	Allow questions and disagreement. Do not interrupt. Record requests for information.
Confirm	Restate any commitment accurately. A promise to “review” is not a promise to vote.
Follow up	Send thanks and promised material within twenty-four hours. Continue through the staff contact.

Meeting close: “Thank you for your time. Our request is that you [action]. We will send [information] to [staff name] by [date]. May we contact your office again after the next hearing?”

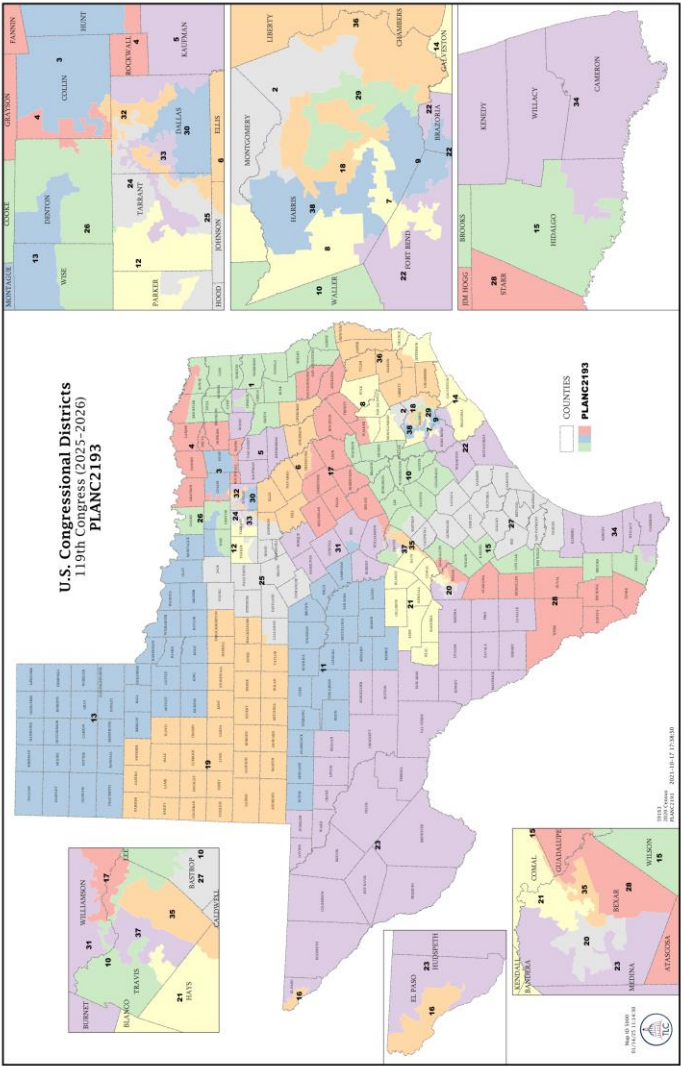

Candidate campaign intervention is prohibited for 501(c)(3) organizations	Do not use organizational resources to support or oppose a candidate for public office.
Nonpartisan voter activity can be permissible	Voter registration, get-out-the-vote activity and voter education must be conducted without bias toward candidates or parties.
Lobbying is limited, not automatically forbidden	A 501(c)(3) organization may engage in some lobbying, but it cannot become a substantial part of its activities under the applicable federal test.
Leaders retain individual rights	Pastors, officers and employees may participate personally when they clearly act in an individual capacity and do not use organizational resources or imply institutional endorsement.
Keep entities and finances separate	When related organizations have different tax classifications, document fair-market reimbursements, staff time, mailing lists, facilities and communications.
Get advice before the crisis	Use qualified counsel before major voter guides, candidate events, paid political advertising, coordinated activity or substantial legislative campaigns.

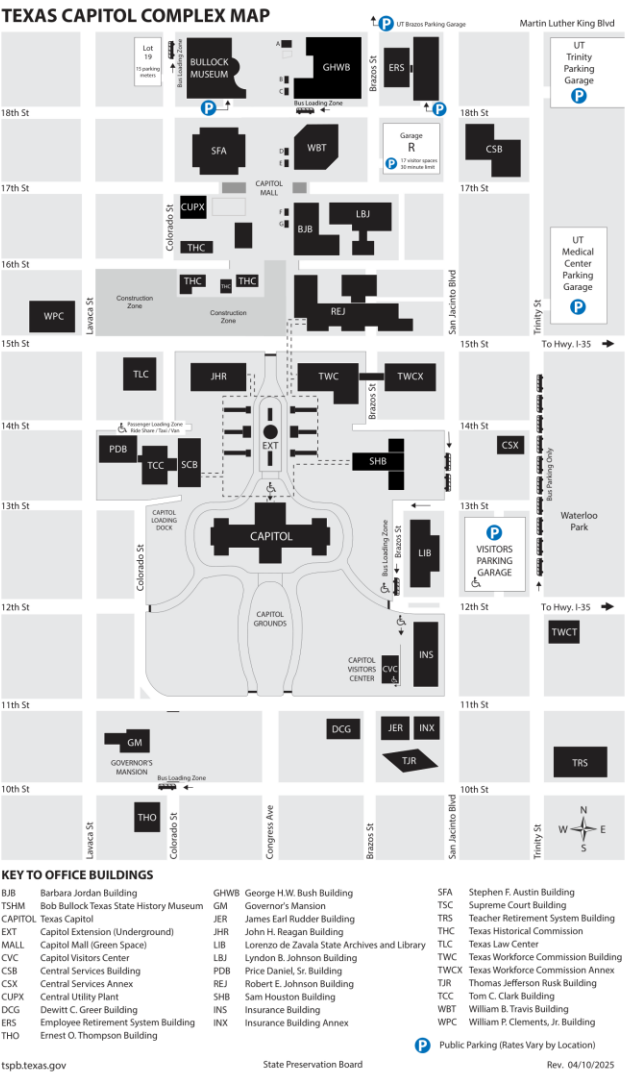
